The **IMPACT Initiative** is led by Dialogue Fiji in partnership with the Pacific Centre for Peacebuilding and funded by the European Union. It seeks to strengthen justice and the rule of law in Fiji by improving the documentation of human rights violations, supporting victims, building community capacity and promoting policy reform.

WHY IT MATTERS

Human rights abuses can go unreported when people fear retaliation, lack information or cannot access legal and support services. Rural and marginalised communities, community leaders and civil society organisations also need stronger tools to document cases and advocate for change.

OUR RESPONSE

IMPACT brings research, secure documentation, community education, victim support, public awareness and policy engagement into one coordinated national initiative. The approach is victim-centred, trauma-responsive and gender-responsive.

WHAT THE PROJECT WILL DO

1 RESEARCH AND DOCUMENT

Conduct nationwide research and publish a comprehensive report on human rights violations.

2 BUILD A CENTRALISED DATABASE

Develop a secure platform to document and analyse cases and support evidence-based advocacy and policy-making.

3 EQUIP COMMUNITIES

Provide human rights awareness and documentation training and engage rural and marginalised communities.

4 RAISE PUBLIC AWARENESS

Produce accessible materials and multimedia campaigns using local languages, storytelling and survivor experiences.

5 INFLUENCE INSTITUTIONS

Engage policymakers, law enforcement, the judiciary and civil society through briefs, submissions, dialogues and roundtables.

6 SUPPORT WOMEN AND VICTIMS

Establish a Women in Defence Network and provide a reporting hotline, counselling and limited legal assistance.

WHO THE PROJECT WILL WORK WITH

Victims and survivors; marginalised communities; women; community leaders; civil society and community-based organisations; government and law enforcement agencies; policymakers; the judiciary; and the wider Fijian public.

THE CHANGE WE SEEK

A Fiji where violations are documented, victims can report safely, communities can advocate effectively, and institutions are better able to prevent impunity and uphold accountability.



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
